FINAL PHASE OF RESTORATION AT ROLLINS CHAPEL RESTORATION SLATED FOR SUMMER COMPLETION

The Joseph Gnazzo Company, Inc. will begin the final phase of restoration services to the Rollins Chapel at Dartmouth College in Hanover, New Hampshire this summer. Current services include the restoration of the chapel tower, as well as granite and brownstone work on the North and South entrances and stairs. The Chapel was designed by John L. Faxon of Boston, and built in 1884 in the neo-Romanesque style. The original building was constructed of granite with red sandstone trimming and the floor plan was in the form of a Greek cross, with a seating capacity of approximately 600. The structure has undergone many renovations and expansions throughout its history. Over the past few years, Joseph Gnazzo Company employees have worked on the envelope of the building, work which entailed granite façade pointing and reconstruction, slate and stone repair & replacement, brownstone patching and cleaning services. Rollins Chapel serves as an inter-faith worship center at Dartmouth, and also plays host to events such as concerts, memorial services, and weddings. Building Envelope Consultants out of Portland, ME is the restoration consultant and construction manager for this project.

SACRED HEART ST. FRANCIS DE SALES Two Congregations Merged Under One Impressive Roof

St. Francis de Sales has the distinction of being the first Catholic Church in southern Vermont. The cornerstone of the current dolomite limestone church building was blessed and laid on July 4, 1889. The congregation merged with Sacred Heart Parish over 106 years later in July 1995. The Joseph Gnazzo Company, Inc. has been providing restoration services to this beautiful cathedral for several years. Our first engagement was to provide immediate stabilization, rebuilding the lower sections of the buttresses, while repointing and grouting the interior cavities in the stone work above. The bell tower was also stabilized by rebuilding large stone areas, repointing and grouting. Currently, we are constructing a new handicap ramp, with the scope entailing site and concrete work, installation of railings and miscellaneous metals, as well as the construction of a stone entryway. Total restoration of the church is expected to be complete by early Summer 2009.
